DC Chapter Director

Another liturgical year is nearing an end. In these final weeks of ordinary time, the scriptures point us to the end times, Christ coming as our King, and the promise of eternal life. We then have the privilege of beginning the salvation story anew by turning to the incarnation, God with us. Advent brings the hope, joy, and promise of a transformed and deeper connection with the story of Christ, and the

reminder that we are a Paschal people from start to finish.





This year we also have the opportunity of experiencing the start of the three-year cycle by going back to the Gospel of Matthew in Year A. On the fourth Sunday of Advent, we hear the announcement of the angel to Joseph as recounted in the first chapter of Matthew.



This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.

Joseph did what many would not do. His "yes" rescued Mary from being an unwed mother and the punishment and ostracization that she surely would have endured, and he saved Jesus from the lifelong taint of an illegitimate birth. As a Jewish man he was certainly familiar with the prophet Isaiah foretelling the birth of the Messiah, but what a shock to learn in a dream that he would become the earthly father of the Savior of the Jewish people. Only an extraordinarily godly and loving man would arise from his dream and do exactly as he was told! And how different would our story have been if he wasn't obedient to the angel. So, we have the opportunity this Advent to ponder the story of Joseph. If you are looking for a piece of music which beautifully encapsulates Joseph's encounter, consider using "Song of Elizabeth/Song of Joseph". As an added bonus, the same piece may also be used when the scripture points us to the Visitation. As we journey ever closer to a new liturgical year and cycle may we find new places to say yes to Christ's call in our lives and make space for the encounter of God with us.

Blessings to you and all those you love as we anticipate and prepare for the arrival of our Savior as a child and coming King.

On Saturday, October 22, Janet Natale graciously came down to Precious Blood Catholic Church in Culpeper to present an enriching local workshop for cantors. There were eighteen cantors from Precious Blood, St. Isidore the Farmer in Orange and from St. John's in Mclean in attendance. Many of the cantors volunteered to sing through a psalm and receive personal tips and advice on how to proclaim it even more effectively. We learned techniques to help with breath control, phrasing, gestures and psalm preparation. We learned to ask ourselves "Who is doing the speaking in this psalm?" and "To whom is this psalm being addressed? (God or assembly?)" and how that should change our countenance and delivery. Janet shared her expertise gently but honestly in such a way that all were able to learn helpful ways to improve in their personal ministry as leaders of sung prayer at the altar of God. Thank you, Janet, for blessing us with your time and talents! And a special thank you to Rick Gibala for arranging this great opportunity for those of us on the outskirts of our diocese!




St. Cecilia Prayer Resource: Free to all NPM members





Dr. Don E. Saliers

Dr. Don E. Saliers has served as the Candler School of Theology Theologian-in-Residence since 2014, after retiring in 2007 as the William R. Cannon Distinguished Professor of Theology and Worship at Emory University. For many years he directed the Master of Sacred Music program at Emory, and was an organist and choirmaster at Cannon Chapel for 35 years. Prior to 1974, Saliers taught at Yale Divinity School, and has taught in summer programs at Notre Dame, Boston College, Vancouver School of Theology, St. John's University, and Boston University School of Theology.

An accomplished musician, theologian and scholar of liturgics, Saliers is the author of 15 books on the relationship between theology and worship practices, as well as more than 150 articles, essays, chapters in books and book reviews. He co-authored A Song to Sing, a Life to Live with his daughter Emily Saliers, a member of the Indigo Girls.
